Contact Your Chapter Members Who Have Not Renewed Their Membership

Annual Service Deactivation – 29 February

All members who did not renew for 2024 by 31 December have a two-month grace period in which to renew without losing access to their benefits. On 29 February, that grace period ends, and any member who has not yet renewed will have their benefits and services deactivated. Multiple communications are sent to alert these members, and all Chapters are encouraged to reach out to this audience as well.

After 29 February, using IEEE OU Analytics, Chapter Chairs can view those members who were deactivated (placed into Arrears), or who have canceled (deleted) their Society membership.

To Do This Month

Action: Submit Your 2023 Chapter Meeting Activity to Qualify for Annual Rebate (Deadline 15 March 2024)

The 2024 IEEE Geographic Unit Rebate process has begun. To qualify for the annual MGA dues rebate, units are required to submit financial, officer, and meeting reporting:

- Meeting reports 15 March
- Annual officer report 15 March
- Annual financial report
 - Geographic unit Treasurers are responsible for recording the financial activity of their unit and any subunits (Subsections, Chapters, and/or Affinity Groups) using NextGen.

The geographic Section/Council is eligible to receive US\$200 for each Chapter that meets the meeting minimum requirements in accordance with the MGA Operations Manual, Section 9.7.J - Chapter Requirements for Membership and Meeting Activity. A Chapter shall be required to hold not less than two (2) technical meetings per year. In accordance with Section 3.4.D - Geographic Unit Activity Bonus, all Chapters reporting (6) or more meetings shall receive an additional US\$75; at least (6) of the reported meetings shall be in the technical category.

In accordance with the MGA Operations Manual, Sections 9.7.G, Chapters are entitled to receive the funds generated by their own activities, including dues rebates (earned during the preceding year as computed by the dues rebate formula). In accordance with the MGA Operations Manual, Section 9.5.I, Chapter and Affinity Group funds provided to the Section through the annual rebate are intended for the support of those subunits. Chapters and Affinity Groups shall be funded at a minimum at the level of the annual rebate.



IEEE Industrial Electronics Society (IES) Egypt Chapter Supports Sustainable Smart Projects and Increases Membership

The **IEEE Industrial Electronics Society (IES) Egypt Chapter**, recipient of the 2023 IEEE IES Best Chapter Award, has established numerous engaging programs, including the "Sustainable smARt Applications (SARA)" initiative, which connects University students developing sustainable smart projects with the market as startups. The SARA initiative also aims to educate low-income students from primary schools in Egypt about robotics and artificial intelligence. Through the initiative, over 100 University students' projects were developed, one of them achieving third position in an interstudent branch competition for manufacturing a 1kW wind turbine. Another project achieved seventh worldwide from an IEEE standards competition among 800 submissions for manufacturing a sustainable smart irrigation system.

The IES Egypt Chapter taught primary schools Robotics and participated in two competitions with those students. The Chapter has also collaborated with other IES Chapters, e.g. with the IES Guadalajara Chapter, and with the IES/PELS Austria and Romania Chapters to host a Marine Energy Technologies (MET) online conference.

The Chapter started with 35 members and now has 69, as a result of Chapter activities. The Chapter also opened two IES Student Branch Chapters in Egypt last year, for the first time.

What can your Chapter do now?

- Reach out to your Society/Council's Chapters in other parts of the world to discuss virtual collaboration
